Information for Humanitarian Needs Overviews to Plan Strategic Response



How many people are in need of humanitarian assistance and protection, irrespective of which sectors the needs originate from.



How severe is the humanitarian situation that results from the compounding effect of overlapping needs in different sectors.



How many people face needs in specific sectors and how severe their needs are, using a common interoperable reference.



How people's needs overlap, co-exist and interrelate.



Which population groups and geographic areas face the most needs.



Why a crisis is happening and what are the key characteristics.

Key Value Added

People-Centered

JIAF 2.0 considers the coexistence of different needs, and how their combined effects lead to humanitarian conditions.

Better Collaboration

JIAF 2.0 brings together humanitarian actors at the country level to analyze needs in a participatory manner.

Interoperable Sectoral Estimations

JIAF 2.0 provides common interoperable references to foster greater interoperability and connectivity between sector-specific analyses.

The Best of Different Methods

JIAF 2.0 utilizes both automated statistical analysis as well as structured, participatory, and consensus-building processes.

While JIAF provides global benchmarks, it also uses context-specific methods, data, and knowledge to ensure relevance and applicability in different contexts.

Online Cloud Analysis Platform

In the JIAF 2.0 Analysis Platform, analysts upload and organize information, interpret data through interactive visualizations, and complete workspaces.

A Simple Process with Intuitive Methods

JIAF 2.0 is embedded into the Humanitarian Programme Cycle and only adds two multi-partner working sessions to identify common parameters for analyses and to bring together sectoral findings and conduct intersectoral analyses.

JIAF 2.0 includes a set of workspaces and reference tables, organized around three modules: 1. Contributing Factors and Scope, 2. Interoperable Sectoral Needs, and 3. Intersectoral Needs.
